Recycling – William McGuire

Computers –

Took part in two recycling efforts in Colorado in 2009.

Actually three if you count the one at the Aurora Mall on March 7 but because of the turnout was not able to recycle anything. Obviously the sponsors were not expecting the hordes of people and old electronics. We and along with most people had to return home with our load.

The first drop-off that worked was held at the American Legion Post #87 at 1427 Elmira in Aurora. At this event we contributed several computers, monitors, printers and assorted parts. They charged \$20 for the load and told me that they got enough money form the event to make it worthwhile. The other entity involved was A1 Electronic Recycling.

The other drop-off was at Goodwill near Chambers and Iliff in Aurora where we donated PC computers, printers, monitors, old televisions and even an old air conditioner. For general information Goodwill has partnered with companies like Dell and will accept computers etc for no charge and even provide a donation receipt for tax purposes.

This is the second year that AI did not accept any new equipment for recycling.

This is also the second year that we did not donate any computers to other organizations.

The indications are that this field has changed substantially. The organizations that are mainly involved in recycling seem to be crushing the equipment and doing very little transferring to people.

We continue as an information resource and advise people on places to go for recycling and have facilitated the transfers.

“The economy seems to be playing a part in this area as well as all the others – many people only want to donate very old junk or broken or old monitors, the rest being sold on places like Craigslist. Also organizations that previously channeled our recycled computers to their clients appear to be not using this resource.” From 2009 report and still true.

General Recycling

Printer Cartridges: Though most office supply houses (Office Depot/Office Max) take old cartridges and even give a small credit (\$3) another option is to reuse the cartridge by refilling. We tried one company (www.tonerrefilkits.com) for refilling of laser cartridges (HP LaserJet 1100). They sell the ink powder, provide specific procedures for particular models and tools for the process. The cost is substantially less and our experience over the past year is that the process works. One partial re-fill lasted almost the entire year and we are on the second refill of the same cartridge.

Glass Bottles: We have been recycling our glass bottles from the annex-office for most of last year and once again the economy has been a big factor in this issue. As we went from drop off place to place the ones kept shutting down – went through three in about six months all sponsored by El Jebel. Talked to a representative of the city of Aurora who said that the problem was that the recyclers could not make any money selling glass so the effort stopped. There are still two places left to take glass one at the dump (Waste Management) down Gun Club Road at Hampden and the other at 21710 E Arapahoe Rd in Aurora. Neither place is especially accessible though Aurora told me that they are applying for a grant to set up a recycling location in North Aurora.

Newspapers: Still being recycled at King Soopers and other locations.

Water: We set up a rain barrel in the shower room by the pool to use the water before it got hot to replenish the pool. And current thinking is that another rain barrel might be useful to catch the rain water off the roof to use for plants. (This is a controversial issue due to current Colorado law.)

Compost: We recycled an old compost bin and placed it in the yard next to the old garden. And purchased a recycling container for the kitchen. (09-0068 GRN LARGE COMPOST BUCKET (9.6 QT) GREEN1\$20.00 – From Gaiam)

Solar Project



We are continuing to monitor our solar system which continues to perform quite well.

The quick description is that four solar panels are powering the two main computers in the office. This is an off the grid system, complete with Kyocera 135 Watt (17.7 V / 7.63 A at rated output) panels, Outback battery controller and inverter, 4 L-16 batteries and assorted other equipment.

We also attended an event in Fort Collins this past summer where we were impressed by the home built wind generator from a local group. HMMMMMMMMMMMMMM

There was a lot of discussion about the changing nature of recycling common items like glass bottles http://www.fountainoflight.net/publish/article_5059.shtml. El Jebel which had about four drop off locations in Aurora removed the bins and discontinued the effort.

The most available option is to use the services of a company like Waste Management and pay a fee or to use someone who already has the service as a drop off spot.
